This is the Samson Stomp's twenty-fifth year. It will be held on Sunday, January 16, 2005. The Samson Stomp honors the late Samson the gorilla who was one of the zoo's most popular attractions. Samson always put on a great show for the spectators and was loved by many. The money that is raised by the Samson Stomp helps support all of the animals at the zoo, not just the gorillas.

I am excited to be the new race director of the Samson Stomp and Romp. I have been a member of the Badgerland Striders for twenty years and I felt that it was time that I direct one of the club's races. I was lucky to be selected as director of the Samson Stomp as it is a quality race that has very qualified Captains.

The Samson Stomp offers four different events, all of which take place completely within the zoo. There is a 5K competitive run that starts at 9:30am. This event has age group divisions every five years and




awards the first three places in each division. If you are competitive take note that last year's male winner, Ryan Gasper ran it in 16:21. The first female, Stacia Beste won with a time of 17:44.

There is a two mile run/walk that starts at 10:15am.

Everyone receives a ribbon in the children's events. There's a one mile romp for kids ages 7-12 that starts at 10:45am and a quarter-mile mini-romp for 2-6 year olds that starts at 11:00am.

This is a fun event for the whole family. Advance registration fees are \$15 for the 5k run or 2 mile walk, \$14 for the romps. Families of four or more can register for \$12 per person. On race day, the fee is \$17 for everyone. Corporate teams are encouraged to participate. The team fee is \$120 for a team of ten.

Runners will receive a long sleeve t-shirt and will be given refreshments after the run at the Peck Center. Entry into the zoo and parking are free-- so lets get romping!

Try Something New?

So, you've taken part in all the 2004 Strider Races, and like me, are planning your running calendar for 2005. I thought I'd help you out by suggesting some alternatives to races in the good old USA. Running in International events exposes us to different cultures, rituals, customs, and different dos and don'ts. Some of the events I list are actual events; others are figments of my imagination. See if you can guess which are real, which are embellishments.

Medellin Marathon, (Colombia). If you choose to run this one, run fast, and keep your head down. And get plenty of sleep, as yawning in Colombia is considered rude.

WANNA RUN BOSTON?

Entrants must have run a qualifying time after September 27, 2003 at a certified marathon in order to participate in the 2005 race. All participants must adhere to the guidelines set forth by the B.A.A., USA Track and Field or foreign equivalent, Wheelchair Athletics USA, and the International Stoke-Mandeville Wheelchair Sports Federation. Qualifying times must be met in competitions observing these same rules. Proof of qualification must accompany the application. Participants must be 18 years or older on race day.

Qualifying times are based upon your age on the date of the Boston Marathon in which you will be participating.

Race for the Cure sees Record Attendance

On behalf of the race, and the cause, I would like to extend my thanks to everyone who participated in this year's Komen Milwaukee Race for the Cure. With 5,273 participants, a record attendance high was set this year. The number of timed participants was 615. The nature of the event lends itself to attracting more walkers than timed runners.

This year the weather finally cooperated, which may have helped with the record turnout. In years past, this event has been plagued by foul weather. You know the kind; frigid cold, stiff wind, and pouring rain. We have had it all in the past. September 19th was beautiful and sunny with temperatures in the 70's.

I was proud to be a Strider during this event. A lot of people came together and helped out with the race. It was a good demonstration of how we stick together as a club and help one another. Special thanks go out to the race captains who included: Kris Hinrichs, John Rodee, Dick Menzel, Tom Anderson, Andy Arena, Marty Malin, Jerry Anderson, and especially Don Weyer (for measuring the new course and obtaining certification).

The course was all new this year and it was a big hit. Instead of pounding the pavement mostly through city streets, as in the past, we directed the crowd down to the scenic lakefront. The race started at Northwestern Mutual (Cass St. and Wisconsin Ave.) proceeded down Prospect to the Mason St.



bridge (right by the museum), down the hill and along the seawall at Veterans Park. The course made a sharp turn at "the point," doubled back and right past the "little house on the prairie." The course stayed mostly on the bike paths, following them around the lagoon and then back up the Mason St. bridge. The course finished just past the intersection of Mason St. and Prospect Ave.

The whole purpose of the Komen Race for the Cure is to raise money for breast cancer research. The money raised goes to fund local programs and research. I'm happy to say that the money collected (race fees and donations combined) for

this important cause was over \$200,000 in 2004. Wow! I'm proud to have been a part of it. If you have any questions about Komen please visit the website at www.milwaukeeraceforthecure.com/

We had a new course record this year. Joe Herington of Brookfield finished in 16:08 with a 5:12 pace. Congratulations Joe! Tim Donahugh was not far behind, finishing in 16:08 with a 5:15 pace. The third place male was Mark Rutledge from Milwaukee who finished in 16:40 with a 5:22 pace.

The first place woman was Denise Manthy. She finished in 19:34. Second place went to Ann Limberg from Sheboygan Falls who finished in 20:10. Mary Bowe from West Allis took third place in 20:31.



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
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Times Past: Yesterday and Today**The 3,422 mile Transcontinental Foot Race**

We've all heard of Route 66 and the song of the same name that beckons us to get our kicks on Route 66. What you may not know is that when the highway was still incomplete, there was a race to promote and raise funds to complete construction of the highway.

Route 66 was one of many transcontinental highways created in the 1920's as automobiles became a major form of transportation. Route 66 connected Chicago with Los Angeles as it passed through the states of Illinois, Missouri, Kansas, Oklahoma, Texas, New Mexico, Arizona and California. No other highway captured America's imagination as did Route 66. It was the highway traveled by the mythical Joad Family in John Steinbeck's *The Grapes of Wrath*. Henry Fonda starred in the John Ford production of the movie version as the Joads left the parched soil of Oklahoma to travel to the land of opportunity in southern California to pick grapes.

Known as the road to opportunity, Route 66 was also nicknamed "America's Main Street," and was the ultimate road trip as it passed through the birth place of the corndog and other tourist traps such as the original London Bridge. The song "Route 66" was written by Bobby Troup and made popular by Nat King Cole. In addition, Sterling Silliphant produced a weekly television show called Route 66 in the early 1960's which chronicled the adventures of two men traveling down the highway in their red corvette.

The original idea for a race came from Lon Scott, an early Route 66 publicist. Scott took his idea to C. C. Pyle who was known as the P. T. Barnum of professional sports. Pyle was able to attract 275 men (women were not permitted) who paid an entry fee of \$100.00 to run 3422.3 miles from Los Angeles to New York. The race followed Route 66 from Los Angeles to Chicago and continued through Indiana, Ohio, Pennsylvania, New Jersey and New York. The top prize was \$25,000 followed by lesser prize money to anyone finishing in the top ten. The official name of the race was C. C. Pyle's First Annual International Trans-Continental Foot Race. There was no second annual race, as this was a one hit wonder. The race was also known as The Great American Foot Race and was dubbed by reporters as the Bunion Derby.

The race began in grand style from the Ascott Speedway in Los Angeles where 500,000 spectators gathered to view the start on March 4, 1928 at 3:30 p.m. By the end of the first day, 77 had dropped out. After the second day, twelve quit, followed by eighteen more on the third day. Blisters, heat exhaustion and fallen arches were the major causes for quitting. Some doctors predicted that the race would take five to ten years from the lives of the runners.

The race passed through towns along Route 66 that Pyle could get to pay a fee. The fee was in exchange for publicity that the town received as part of the race. Runners covered an average of forty miles each day. The shortest distance in one day was seventeen miles on day one. The longest distance

was 74.6 miles on the 79th day in New York State.


Ultimately, all finishers ran the same distance by starting together each morning. They had to reach a designated checkpoint by midnight to avoid disqualification. A runner's place in the race was determined by his cumulative time.

In the Texas panhandle, a twenty-year old Cherokee Indian named Andrew Hartley Payne, moved up with the leaders. At this point, there were less than one hundred runners still in the race. Near the Oklahoma state line, Payne took the lead for the first time and remained there as the race passed through Claremore, Oklahoma, the halfway point (which, incidentally, was close to Payne's home town). Payne's closest competition was Peter Gavuzzi, an Italian from Southampton, England, who was one of the favorites. Their duel continued until Gavuzzi dropped out in Ohio with an infected tooth.

When the runners reached Chicago, the end of the Route 66 leg, there were seventy runners left. By the time they reached Madison Square Garden in New York City, 87 days after the start, only 55 of the 275 starters were still in the race. Andy Payne was the winner, completing the 3422.3 miles in 573 hours, 4 minutes. Payne used the \$25,000 prize to pay off the mortgage on his parents' farm. In 1934 he became clerk of the Oklahoma Supreme Court, and was reelected seven times.

The Bunion Derby accomplished its goal as a promotional event that improved the image of the highway and helped make Route 66 a household word. The highway had its heyday until 1956 when the interstate highway system was established. The faster interstate was the death of the highway, although today there is renewed interest in Route 66. Many of the establishments are still around and Route 66 historical societies and memorabilia are flourishing.

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

THE DIFONZO SURRENDER

The Kenyan looked over his shoulder with the Russian in hot pursuit. After months of preparation for this moment, he could not have imagined it would come down to this. The Kenyan's life flashed by in his mind, the fatigue of the day blinding his thoughts as the end drew near.

The Russian, now on the Kenyan's heals, took aim, fired – and, with less than a half-mile to freedom, passed him. And so the drama of the finish of this year's Grandma's Marathon played out like a cold war novel.

Likewise, intrigue surrounded the annual Badgerland Striders Bus Trip to Duluth. Months before, rumors had been circulated that the bus trip was being cancelled. Other rumors that the bus was being filled by interlopers known as triathletes, also came to the organizer's attention. Even completing this article seemed to be the target of sabotage when, in the course of writing it, my computer crashed.

Because of the ongoing terrorist threats in the country and the "chatter" on the graffiti board of the Badgerland Strider website, security was tight. Supplies for the trip were procured the night before departure and the beer supply was carefully guarded up to the time it was loaded onto the bus on the morning of June 18th.

Despite Dave Gavinski's recommendations to do so, however, we stopped short of patting down the travelers before boarding.

Our guest list, this year, included many regulars as well as a few celebrities.

Those who've made riding the trip to Duluth an annual pilgrimage and so were with us again this year included Dave Gavinski, Barbara Jewell, Helen Schmidt, Grant Nelson, Ted Itzov, Linda Pulkowski, Cindi Bergs and Bonnie Cleary. Dick Berg, Strider member and our driver for his 17th year, was again, captain of the bus.

Our celebrity guests included Peter Linton-Smith of Channel 6 news fame, Chris Carnazzo – a producer of sports promos for Channel 4, and Ross Strand – the "bouncer" on the Pic n' Save billboards located along various sections of I-94. (The billboards show 5 pears and the caption reads, "only the best get in." Ross's wife, Randi, the creator and producer of the ad was also on the trip.) Coach Dick Dodd, a sub-2:20 marathoner "back-in-the-day" was on board as was his buddy, Steve Szymanski, who was to here for another attempt at Boston Marathon qualification.

Having such notables on the bus made security even more important. Peter had begun (and has since completed) a feature series on 3 marathoners who were training for their first marathon – the recently completed Lakefront Marathon. No doubt Channel 6's competitors fear the success of this series and would probably stop at nothing to see it fail.

All were vigilant on the ride up. A showing of "Caddyshack" lightened the mood somewhat, as did a stop for lunch at the Old Country Buffet in Eau Claire. Later in the afternoon, we reached our destination without incident - so our vigilance obviously paid off.

Sally Koch was our lone participant in the Friday night 5K race. Her 25:28 performance was good enough for an 8th place finish in her division and was a prelude of greatness to come. She went on to finish her first marathon at Lakefront and was one of the women featured in the previously mentioned story by Peter Linton Smith.

After everyone had picked up their race packets, ate at the pasta dinner and finished their last minute shopping, we were driven back to the motel where final preparations were made for the next day's run. Night descended and, hours later, dawn broke for the

next day. Half-marathoners met the bus at 4:45 a.m. which took them to the shuttles waiting at the DECC. The bus returned to the hotel to get the marathoners for a 6:15 a.m. departure to the starting line.

This is where the first mystery of the day occurred. While it was made known that the bus would leave at 6:15a.m. for the marathon start line, Bonnie and Helen had not been present on the bus the evening before when the announcement was made. An obvious plot to keep them from enjoying the beginning of the race, they were told that the bus would leave at 6:30. Thus, when they emerged from the motel that morning, the bus was gone! The wicked mind that concocted such a foul plan was never discovered and remains at large to this day.

The marathon and ½ marathon events unfolded without injury or consequence to our crew. The many intrigues that did take place, did so off the race course.

Standing on the sidewalk at the finish line area with the rest of the spectators, Karen DiFonzo, Kevin Degenaro – who had already run and finished the ½ marathon event – and the author watched and waited for the lead runners. A family standing at the French barricades moved away leaving a gap at the partitions between the race course and crowd. After about 5 minutes, it was obvious no one was going to take advantage of this premium viewing position. So, we moved in. Ten minutes later, one of the women who had occupied the spot prior to us tapped Kevin on the shoulder notifying him of the fact that the spot was hers and that we should move away. Tensions rose and both parties stood their ground. Ever the peacemaker, Karen interceded and calmed the situation – cold silence replacing the verbal joust. A few more minutes passed and the woman left once she understood that the current occupiers would not give up the land that was rightfully theirs.

It is at this point that I must admit to coming into possession of intelligence that Kevin Degenaro was to hatch an offensive on another front later in the morning.

It was for this reason that I kept a close eye on him and his companion, Karen.

It was just after the finish line incident that the series of events he had been orchestrating for weeks would emerge from the drawing board and into reality.



Two out of three first-timers finish Lakefront Marathon

By now you've probably seen the finish results for the 24th annual Lakefront Marathon. Shane Carr of Racine, age 31, won overall in 2:34:34. The leading woman was Aaron Clark, of Lake Forest, IL, in 2:58:30. If these times seem unusually slow, consider that there was a stiff headwind for the last three miles of the race. Complete race results are given in this issue.

Please note that the date for the Twenty-fifth running of LM has been set for Sunday, October 2. You might like to mark your calendar now.

If you've been following the progress of our featured first-time marathon trainees and runners, you'll be happy to hear that two of the three, Sally Koch and Pam Grzybowski, finished with flying colors and expect to run other marathons.

The third one, Barb Ecklund, was forced to quit after just a few miles into the marathon, due to leg and groin pain. However, Barb is hopeful she will be able to train again soon.

I was able to persuade each of them to put their feelings into writing.

First, some words from Sally:

The LFM was a life changing experience for me. It was fun through the entire process of setting goals, training (for the most part), meeting others, learning helpful hints, and running the marathon itself.

I had 3 goals for my first marathon experience: (1) to run the entire distance, (2) to complete within 4 hours and 30 minutes, and (3) to have fun.

I am happy to report that I achieved all 3 of my goals. At the ½ marathon mark I was right on pace. At mile 19, I saw my family and they were amazed at how strong and good I looked. At mile 23, I wanted to walk so bad, especially with the strong head wind. But I quickly said to myself that I just

ran the first 23 miles, and I would be damned if I was not going to finish this race running! With that, I dug down deep mentally and pushed myself physically to the end.

As I was running, the words of my personal 'coach,' BLS member Doug Nelson, were ringing in my ears. He told me often, "Go out slow in the beginning. Some of the runners that pass you at the start, you will pass at the end." I'll be darned if he wasn't right! Although I felt bad for those that were in pain or walking, I also respected their desire to push themselves to their personal limits.

As I crossed the finish line, I was overwhelmed with so many emotions – pride, accomplishment, relief, excitement, gratitude – and energized. I thought of all the training and small sacrifices I made along the way . . . and it was so worth it! I was not physically exhausted, and have determined that I had a lot left. I could have run stronger and pushed harder, but that is part of the first marathon learning curve.

There are so many that supported me through this experience. The BLS, LFM, and Peter Linton Smith certainly helped make this a memorable experience for me. My husband Steve, and son Connor supported me without really understanding why I had to run so many miles. Then, as they watched me and others cross the finish line, they understood.

Doug Nelson, who guided me closely through this process, is part of the informal "Armenian Marathoners" group that I have had the pleasure of training with over the past months. This group of runners has logged well over 100 marathons collectively, and they have much experience to share. I appreciate their support and look forward to logging many more miles, and lots of fun and laughter with them.

First-timers? What about twenty-fourth timers?

Sure, our attention has been riveted to the progress of three first-time marathon runners, but how many of you remember our reporting on those who have run ALL Lakefront Marathons since the beginning of the event?

Someone had suggested I do a story on them in the summer of 2000, well after the 19th LM running. I used the words, "Ran All Nineteen" in the headline, and followed it with the acronym "RANS"** in the body of the article. I believe there were about half a dozen runners who earned that handle.

In the fall of 2000, after the twentieth LM, I did a follow-up on those who "Ran All Twenty." I tried to get away with calling them "RATs,"* but then-editor Sam Martino felt it would be less than appropriate for as prestigious a running publication as *The Strider*.

So here we are in 2004, having just completed the 24th running. Some of the charter runners are still with us, and here is a brief report.

*Notice: hereafter, all obnoxious acronyms have been specifically eliminated from this article.

One reason this report is brief is, now there are fewer runners who have completed all the Lakefront Marathons. Another reason is, it's not an even number. Well, sure, 24 is an even number. It's an even two dozen, and both two and one (a dozen) are even. What I mean is, it's not a *magic* number, since we count to the base ten, and watch for "magic" things to happen at multiples of either five or ten, or

really needed, nothing to it.

Well, then the road construction started. First we learned that the Parks Department was going to re-pave the bike path in Estabrook. The original construction plan had that finished long before our event. However, the abnormal summer changed the construction schedule, so that the path was not going to be finished.

"No problem," we figured, we will run the road in the park and extend the course on the south end. Wrong again. The Brady street bridge construction project changed those plans. I contacted Ken Gilgenbach for help. Ken was able to come up with the necessary 12.4-mile course just two weeks before the run. We ended up with a double loop course.

This run is part of the Lakefront Marathon build up program and gives a good opportunity for first timers to test their training under race conditions. It could give them a pretty good idea of what kind of marathon finish time they could expect. For the average marathoner the finish time for this distance will

represent between 40% and 45% of their over all marathon time. By the time you read this you will have completed your first marathon. See how close this was.

I was out at one of the water stations and it was a real treat to watch some of these runners run. Josh Nygren ran with a pack of his buddies from school and they were amazing to see. Josh took first overall with a finish time of 1:07:01 (5:27 per mile pace) Josh is in the 20 – 25 age group. I suspect we will hear from him again. Nice! Members of the group he was running with took six of the first seven finishes. Randy Damkot of West Bend broke up Josh's party and finished fourth with a time of 1:08:16 Randy is in the 35 – 39 age group. Nice job Randy.

The first overall female was Heather Gollnick from Hartford with a finish time of 1:21:29 (6:34 pace). Great job Heather. She is also an Ironman Triathlon finisher. We have many outstanding runners in the area and a lot of them use this race as a tune up.

Wayne Dalton took first in his age group – (30 –

34) at a 5:44 pace. At this writing he was getting ready for the Quad Cities Marathon followed by the Philadelphia Marathon 5 weeks after that. I overheard him after the run saying he started out a little too fast, the first couple of miles at 5:15. I know I often have that problem (ha ha).

Dave Dehart was not too far behind Wayne.

You can see Dave in the picture of the start of

AI's Run later in the month. Dave took first in his division there.

It was nice to see Cheryl Neumann. She took first in her division.

Jayne Weyer celebrated her birthday on race day. This placed her in a new age division in which she took first.

I wish to thank all of the runners for coming out. I hope next year we will be able to establish a course that may be a little more friendly for the fast runners (four 180 degree turns tend to slow you down) and one we can keep for awhile. We will continue to start in Estabrook. I think all agree the facilities are nicer then down at the lagoon where this run used to start. We will have mile markers again at each mile.

A big thanks to The Ale House for supplying the beer. The Ale House is real supporter of many of our running events; so don't forget them when you are looking for some good food and fun atmosphere, they are located on north Water St. This year we had two-quarter barrels of the very popular Sprecher Root Beer. This has become a tradition for this run. Next year I will see if I can get a sign to identify it (are there any Sprecher people out there?). Many people thought it was more real beer. We still ran out!



Pam reflected similar experiences:

Training for and running my first marathon was such a great experience. And then to finish under 4:30, for me was an accomplishment that I would have never thought possible a year ago.

The last 3 miles were the most difficult and with about a half mile to go, out of nowhere my legs stopped and I started to walk. Thankfully, Fr. Mike' passed by and yelled some words of encouragement. I guess that's all I needed because I started to run again until I crossed the finish line.

I wasn't really able to walk again without pain until that Wednesday, and it's taken a good 3 weeks until I felt that I could start running again (darn that left knee!). I know I'm hooked and plan to run more marathons.

Now here's Barb's story:

I am sorry to say I did not finish the marathon. On Thursday morning before the marathon, I went out for a little 3 mile run. At about 2.8 miles, I got a strange feeling in my hip/groin area, so I stopped running. Later that day, the same area was giving me a nagging pain whenever I stood up and started walking. I rested Friday and Saturday, had no more pain, and felt ready to go Sunday morning.

About 1 mile into to marathon, I started feeling this same groin/hip pain. I told myself I could just

"run through it". At the 7.5 mile rest stop I called it quits, barely able to walk, let alone run. As it was, I had pushed it way too far, not able to put ANY pressure on my leg by Sunday afternoon. The diagnosis is severely tight muscles in my leg-beginning in my calf, going all the way up the outside of the leg, which in turn caused major strain on the hip. Now, nearly a month later, I am just barely able to run, and am still on heavy-duty anti-inflammatory medications.

Needless to say, I was very sad not to have completed the marathon. I had absolutely NO pains or strains all through the training program. The cause of my injury is due to inadequate stretching. Now I understand how important stretching is. I completely admit that I was very lazy about stretching. During training, I would rather run an extra half hour than stretch. Well, I learned my lesson the hard way. Thanks to everyone for the support in training through the summer.

How about it, readers, do the above accounts bring back any memories from your own experiences?

We can certainly congratulate Sally and Pam on their achievements, and support Barb in her healing process. Thanks, first-timers, for opening up and allowing us to follow your progress. Best wishes to all of you!





Iliotibial Band Friction Syndrome

When I recall the years that I have been working with athletes, particularly runners and cyclists, there is a very painful injury that comes up time and time again. Iliotibial (IT) Band Friction Syndrome. The mere mention of this may be causing many of you to pause or even wince recalling the pain of this injury.

IT band syndrome is the most common cause of pain on the outside of the knee in runners and cyclists and it falls into the "Overuse Injury" category. During the summer, through the build up and marathon season I saw an increased number of patients in my office with this diagnosis.

What is the IT band?

The iliotibial band is a thick band of tissue that is about one to two inches wide and has the toughness and feel of Gore-Tex. This fibrous band runs along the outside of your leg beginning at the top of the iliac crest (that bone at your waist that holds up your pants) to just below your knee on the outside-front of your shin bone.

Interestingly enough, the exact purpose of the IT band is not known, but it is believed that it helps stabilize the knees and move the hips.

Why does it hurt so much?

The primary issue is that the IT band is positioned in front of the lateral epicondyle of the femur bone (the bump on the outside of your knee) when your knee is straight and then rubs across and snaps over this bump when your knee is flexed beyond 30 degrees. The IT band then snaps back when the knee is straightened again. You probably realize that this a common action is repeated many thousands of times during a run or bike ride.

Basically, all of this repetitive snapping back and forth can lead to an area of friction that causes irritation and inflammation of the IT band. This will lead to pain of the outside of the knee with activity that can spread up the band or down toward the knee. Normally there is not pain during rest, but it can flare

up when going up and down stairs and about 10-15 minutes into a run.

There are several major factors that can predispose a runner to developing symptoms for IT band syndrome. Internal factors include unbalanced hip muscles, knee malalignment (bowlegged vs. knock-kneed) and foot malalignment (high arch). External factors include running on crowned roads, running primarily downhill and running on hard unforgiving surfaces.

How can we fix it?


A well-rounded treatment plan will focus on addressing the internal and external factors to properly correct the entire problem. For the internal issues – a sports-focused physical therapy program will include: a) stretching regimen for legs, b) strengthening program for hip, trunk and legs, c) corrections for muscle imbalances or malalignments, and d) treatment to decrease inflammation of the IT band (ice, heat, soft tissue work).

The external factors require changes in your personal training and running program. Simple things such as alternating the side of the road you run on, limiting hill running when you are feeling tight or symptomatic and trail or track running when possible all can help.

I would also encourage everyone who runs regularly to be doing exercises to stretch your IT band BEFORE and AFTER running. If you begin to feel the symptoms of IT band syndrome it is important to ice down the outside of your knee after you are done with your post-run stretch. If your symptoms do not seem to respond positively to these simple interventions, then you may be developing a more serious case of IT band syndrome or another injury that should be evaluated by a sports medicine specialist. Some of the best are at the Aurora Sports Medicine Institute, take them up on their Free Injury Evaluation program (800/219-7776), they have seen this problem before and they can help – they helped me.






Shane Carr Male Winner crosses the finish line at the 2004 Lakefront Marathon. Photo by Terry Hagen.

Radio & TV personalities: How did we draw them?

How would you start?

If you were asked, "How could we get celebrities such as Peter Linton-Smith of Fox 6 News and Steve 'The Homer' True of WISN AM 1130," what would you do?

Well, it takes vision. And time. Expertise. And a good bit of energy.

More than three years ago, Kris Hinrichs, Director of Lakefront Marathon, was asking the same questions. You know Kris. She's got a machine running (now more than 50 captains and close to 1000 volunteers), and it keeps on going.

Enter Alex Taylor of Erasmus, LLC, a public relations specialist and runner. Alex assisted Kris in developing a PR program. Enter Jennifer Janowski, who is employed at GE Medical, and lends her expertise in advertising and public relations. Jennifer is a runner too.

Here Jennifer outlines their two-part program.

FIRST – Spend some money selectively on advertising. Be open to opportunities for additional publicity.

SECOND – Perform additional activities (at no cost – remember we're a volunteer group) to raise community awareness. Some examples:

- List LFM on www boards etc. (over 50 sites listed)
- Media releases to newspapers (6 planned, 6 executed)
- Forms distribution to running clubs, stores, races etc.
- email distribution to clubs, stores, races etc.
- email distribution to past runners
- PR: bring in local celebrities that are in the public eye; get them to run the marathon or at least write about it.

Alex was able to develop a relationship with Peter Linton-Smith of Fox 6 News. Here are Alex's words.

"Peter has always expressed interest in making our marathon the best it could be. He would offer his feedback (positive and negative) on the Badgerland Striders online message board. Kris and I thought that if someone was this passionate about a marathon, they should be involved at a 'higher level.'

"When Peter and I met late last fall, our hunch was validated. He has since championed our marathon with his station and with others. He has stayed in constant contact with Matt [Braun] and Kris to consider all media opportunities, and he has been a terrific asset to our stable of media contacts.

"As we look ahead, Peter's contributions will certainly help us share information about the 25th running of the marathon."

It seems PR and media personnel are in constant contact with each other. The story about getting Steve "The Homer" True to run with us is told by Matt Braun of Leum Roberts. Matt is an accomplished marathoner.

"The Homer thing really started because I was listening to his show in mid-summer, and he was talking to John Dorsey from The Packers about a recent marathon Dorsey had completed.

"Homer was ranting about how he could never do a marathon, and I simply shot him a note and said he could do it and the Badgerland Striders would love to help him out. I told him Milwaukee has its own marathon, one the general public isn't really aware of, and next year will mark its 25th year. I offered training etc., and said we'd love to have Kris on the air to talk about it.

"From there, I simply kept in touch with him, offering up Kris as we got closer, and I think he was pretty impressed by the people from Milwaukee who encouraged him."

What we're seeing here is that by engaging a number of skilled persons in pursuit of defined program objectives, we were able to sway a segment of the populace toward the cause of physical activity and well-being.

Now that this has been accomplished by just one of our club events – Lakefront Marathon – couldn't we expect to accomplish more if we got all of our club events involved in a focused PR program?







- ◆ "It was as technically and ruggedly beautiful as possible in the Midwest."
- ◆ "This course may not have mountains, but it sure seems like it does — especially on the way back."
- ◆ "Having run the Ice Age 50 in the Southern Kettle Moraine four times, I can tell you this course [Glacial] is MUCH tougher, especially the rocky down hills."

The comments come from Glacial 50-mile runners Jerry Bollig, Bill Dietrich and Mark Dziedzic. Theirs echo the thoughts of many who come to Wisconsin's Northern Kettle Moraine for the Glacial 50 kilometer or 50 mile race. Held in Greenbush, WI. (about an hour north of Milwaukee), this year's edition took place on October 10.

What's so good about this run?

Well as they say in the real estate business -- location, location, location! The Northern Kettle Moraine is the tougher older brother of the state's southern component,

where the well-known Ice Age race is held in spring. Older brother has quite a few more character marks, quite a few more bumps, and lots of varicose veins snarling everywhere (large enough to trip over, and

over). Northern brother isn't quite as refined as southern. Some say he can even seem a bit harsh at times. Southern brother has nice "Ice Age Friends" who go out and smooth his rough edges, but the northern boy doesn't seem to have acquired quite so many friends, and those who do visit generally decide he's best left as is.

The Glacial follows what has now been named as part of the statewide Ice Age Trail system. Just about the entirety of if it is single track, carpeted with rocks. Sunglasses are rarely needed, since you are almost always under a canopy of trees. This year, runners lucked out -- the fall colors were just about at peak. Unfortunately, to enjoy their beauty, you really had to stop and look around you. To look around while moving generally meant that rocks or roots would take advantage of an opportunity to grab the runner by the toe and send him/her to the ground.

"Oh, but those glowing yellows of the turning aspen grove just about made that face plant worth it," said one runner.

The race directors are Tom and Lorraine Bunk. Both are known for their fast feet (in his 60s, Tom continues to outrun people half his age), warm hospitality and attention to runners' needs.

The original intent of the Glacial was to create something that required a bit of an effort. That's not to say that running 50 kilometers or 50 miles isn't tough, but the Glacial was never meant to be a race that coddled its runners. The grumpy northern brother will allow you to visit, but don't expect him to go out of his way too much to welcome you. If you expect aid stations every 2-3 miles and pretty pink ribbons lining your route, you expect too much.

There is aid and there are directions. In fact, there's more of



both than there were in the "old days" of the race's original incarnation as a 50K and 100K. Back then, you were welcome to aid about every 10 miles or so. Nothing too fancy, but enough to keep you from dying of malnutrition on the trail. Now, aid is available at intervals closer to seven or eight miles. The 50K runners get to see the Butler Lake station on their way back only about four miles after they saw it the first time.

My Glacial 50 mile story

First of all, I want to thank Tom and Lorraine Bunk for directing this outstanding ultra event. The volunteers were exceptional. Some of them were responsible for my completion of this event. (You know who you are --Julie Treder and others) I signed up for the 50 mile. This was my first attempt at that distance. Overconfident from completing a successful Iron man Triathlon a month ago, I thought I could do anything. I was under trained for this distance and I had no business entering. So, I did it anyway.

The run started at 6:00am. The temperature was a crisp 39 degrees. I joined the other runners at the starting line in the dark, headlamp in place and sporting a new pair of trail shoes. I was ready to go. During the first four miles or so I ended up in a "train" of runners. Car after car, with our headlamps attached to our foreheads, we all looked like engines in this train. I found myself fixating on the calves ahead of me. There was some light conversation. Someone would occasionally call out rocks or roots. I felt pretty good at the first aid station.

Shortly after, at about mile 8, my right foot started to tingle with pain. Plantar Fasciitis has recurred in that foot from time to time for the past 13 years. The pain took its toll. In the next few miles I was reduced to walking, which did not relieve the pain. Many of my friends felt bad for me as they caught me and went by. One of them offered me some Aleve. I thought-- at this point, what harm could it do? I was mentally destroyed. I decided to bag it at the 13.3 mile aid station. It seemed to take an eternity to get there. On my way, the first 50k runners were flying by, so I stepped off the trail to cheer them on. I thought I was done.

I made a slow descent down the steps to the aid station. All eyes were on me. I heard my name among the cheering. When I reached the road I dragged my right foot like Quasimodo. I was trying to be funny. I told the volunteers and Tom Bunk that I thought I was going to bag it. I could not see myself continuing in so much pain for 37 more miles. It would be better to drop earlier than later.

After looking at all the faces, many of whom are friends, it suddenly seemed that maybe I could find a way to continue. I could not quit in front of these witnesses. They share incredible credentials like 100 milers, other 50 milers who kept trying that distance until they were successful and an 81-year-old still running Marathons. I wanted a way to keep going. I remembered that I had my trusty racing flats in my drop bag. My plan was to change the shoes and test

run them for a couple miles and see how the foot felt. The moment I put on those shoes and started to hop around, the pain subsided.

Deciding not to drop, off I went up the steps, with all the volunteers pulling for me. I saw many participants who were on their way back from the 25 mile turnaround. Validating my resurrection, some of them said that they knew I wasn't done. Others were surprised to see me moving again. They all seemed happy to see that I was able to pull thru my misery and come back to running life.

I rose up like the Phoenix. I told people that I tried to give up the ghost but the ghost would not give me up. I was able to run the rest of the course. I finished in 10:53. I was filled with emotion as I turned the last corner and saw the finish line. My husband Gene, friends Mary Bolich, Brenda Bland and others were there, so I fought back the tears and finished with a smile.

North Country Trail Run is actually two races – the 50-mile – and a marathon. The marathon is the larger of the two, with 86 finishers this year. Both are run on the same trail. To go 50 miles, participants in the longer race run the marathon course twice.

The course is located in the Manistee National Forest in Michigan's lower peninsula, a few miles east of Manistee, which is just across Lake Michigan from Manitowoc, WI. Participants can either drive around the lake via Chicago, or cross the lake by ferry.

Beth wasn't the only one who said the new course was harder.

"They could have given us a heads-up about the hills between miles 18 and 25," exclaimed one marathon runner from Indiana. The previous course had few hills, and sported a flat, sandy, single-track wilderness trail over most of the distance.

Then, just one month later on October 10, Beth ran the Glacial Trail 50 mile trail run, and again took home the First Master title in the women's race.

As if that wasn't enough, Beth traveled to Arizona to participate in the Javelina Jundred hundred-mile trail race, and again was the second female finisher and earned the First Master title. Her time was 21:51:20.

Beth, an experienced and well-known ultramarathoner, works as a personal trainer in Mequon, and has completed the Western States 100 mile run over mountain trails, three times.

So the aid stations don't saturate the course, but they do satiate runners well. Food, food and more food. Remembering requests from races past, aid station captains stocked their tables like a mini 7-11. Everything from olives (a favorite of 50K runner Cathy Drexler) to Payday bars (the author's choice for endurance fuel) were at the tables.

Racers were treated this year not only to the peak of fall colors, but perfect temperatures as well. Starting temps were in the 40s and never got out of the 60s. Previous rains had drained well from the course and left only a very few spots of mud. Some leaves were down, but not enough to camouflage the rocks -- runners generally could see what they were going to fall over. Last year, heavy rains right before the race brought the leaves down and coated the rocks like a slippery carpet. One generally didn't know what was tripped over until the runner's nose hit the ground and brushed the leaves away.

Glacial's rocks and other rough edges were of particular note to geologist and 50 kilometer runner Thom Patterson.

"Having earned two degrees in geology, my brain knows more about glacial terrain than most," he said. "I can tell you off the top of my head that a moraine is

I will get the memory ball rolling by sharing some of my memories of this event. Al's has been a part of our lives in one way or another since its inception.

My husband Jeff, has been a runner since before I met him. I've made an effort to become a runner a couple of times in our history together, but have been unsuccessful to date. I did run with him for a while back in 1976, until I realized that it caused me to become pregnant (well, it probably wasn't the running- but it seemed so at the time), Jeff continued to run and was still running in 1977 for the very first Al's Run.

He always ran Al's ... even during the times that he wasn't running on a regular basis. There may have been a couple years that Al's was the only running he did for the entire year, but he always made a point of running Al's.

I remember being emphatic about NOT wanting him to run on September 26th, 1981. Our daughter was ready to be born at any minute – but... Jeff could not break tradition and ran Al's anyway. Brandi was patient and waited until he could be present. Actually she waited until the 29th to make her entrance into the world.

When Pat McGuire started leading the walk, I would participate with the kids and sometimes the dog.

A few years stand out in my mind more than others. I can still see the mozzarella marinara flying across the Summerfest grounds the year I decided braces would make a terrific eleventh birthday present for Brandi. The poor kid's mouth hurt so much that she couldn't chew and started choking. It was good to learn first hand that the Heimlich maneuver really does work.

Another unforgettable Al's Run was the year that we decided to take the bus to the start line – but the bus didn't come, so we walked from 53rd and Wisconsin. Actually, Jeff ran ahead and caught the end of the starting runners. I managed to make it in time to tag behind the walkers as they started.

Jeff has not run this run since the year 2000, because he has been too busy "running" it. My participation has also changed since the beginning of this century. Now I get to start before the leaders – even before Jeff. I have the fun job of being a split timer and shouting out the times to runners at the one-mile mark. As race director, Jeff rides behind me in the "pace car."

Over the years the fact that this run is a fundraiser for Children's Hospital has always been important to us. We have been fortunate enough that we haven't needed to utilize their services, but it was always a comfort to know that if our kids ever needed to be hospitalized, the very best place for them was right here in our city.

The years have flown by and our children have been adults for quite some time. Now I have an additional reason to understand the importance of our Children's Hospital and this event that has always been such an integral part of our family.

Our daughter Brandi has worked in the Pediatric Intensive Care Unit (the PICU) for the last year. She is a nurse intern and will continue her work there when she completes her bachelor's degree in nursing this December.

She often shares with us the many miracles that are performed at Children's. She continues the family commitment. She's a team captain for the Children's Hospital team and is in the process of taking on the role of volunteer coordinator for the run.

It seems that as long as there is a run for Children's Hospital, the Weiss family will be playing some sort of role.

a glacial deposit of unsorted boulders, pebbles, and dirt. After doing Glacial, my body now knows that the definition of a moraine also includes deposits of @&%\$ ankle twisters, #!% toe grabbers and *#@#%& arch busters!"

At the Glacial 50/50 you get a great workout AND a lesson in geology. Such a deal!

Fifty mile runners took off at 6 a.m. and were treated to about an hour of darkness on the trails. Unfortunately, a few of these early runners didn't think about the fact that the sun wasn't going to rise as early as they were that day. Even eventual race winner Stuart Kolb had to stick close to his "enlightened" competitors for a while since he was without a light. But as Robert Werner, eventual sixth place male, noted, "Once the sun came up he was gone."

Kolb's name may be familiar — the Green Bay native also took top honors at the Ice Age 50-miler in May. His Glacial time of 7:23:50 was almost an

hour ahead of second place Erik Kaitala of Duluth. The race for second was a little closer, with Parker Rios coming in about five minutes behind Kaitala. However, the race for third overall was much tighter. Rios was only 24 seconds ahead of first-place female Lisa Trainor.

Trainor, from Maple Grove, Minn., has also made a name for herself in the Midwest. Having battled Minnesota Voyageur's worst heat conditions ever, she won last year's race, and this year came in second to Duluth's Kim Holak.

The 50 kilometer runners took off just as the sun was coming over the horizon at 7 a.m. Heading toward the same course as the 50 milers, they kept on going and initially passed the turn off the road and on to the trail. A mid-packer quickly realized the front-runners' error and yelled to them to get back on-course. The fleet of feet but slow of direction soon made their way back to the trail and back to their rightful position ahead of the rest of the mortals.

However, one of the speedsters was keeping her identity hidden for a bit -- Christine Crawford. Posing as a casual runner out for a relaxed day in the woods, she hung back for several miles, comfortably chatting with those around her. But after warming up, she was able to get that transmission of hers working and shifted up a few gears and a few places. By the turn-around she was close to female race leader Aimee Kurian and on the way back caught her and went on to win in 4:58. Many of runners are familiar with Crawford, but Kurian is still an ultra-running newbie, having done only just two other 50 kilometer runs. Young (25) and very fleet of feet, she'll be runner to watch in the future.

In the men's race, it was another young (26), ultra newbie who took top honors. Greg Feucht was the only runner to break four hours (3:56). Amazingly, Glacial was only his second 50 kilometer run. His first was a month earlier near his home of Ann Arbor, Mich., at Dances with Dirt. There, he came in second with a time only seven minutes slower.

Coincidentally, just as Feucht was finishing, his sister Andrea (also an ultrarunner) left a message on his cell phone with a prediction for his finish time. Sister must know brother well because her predicted time was EXACTLY what Feucht's actual finish time was. "My jaw dropped when I listened to the voicemail message," said Feucht. "And you can bet that she has the task of calling me at the end of every forthcoming race — with predictions of world-record times, of course!"

The second 50 kilometer runner in was local ultra veteran Joel Lammers (first master), followed four minutes later in 4:19, by Matt Zak of North Chicago. Zak, 31, is another newbie. Besides being his first ultra, Glacial was only his fourth running race ever, having practiced first with two marathons and a 10 kilometer run. "But I enjoyed this race so much more than the marathons," he said, "mainly because of the beautiful scenery and the rollercoaster Ice Age landscape."

Although it is often thought of as more of a regional race, Glacial was host this year to several Canadian runners from Winnipeg taking advantage of a long weekend for Canadian Thanksgiving to make the trip.

Evidently, they decided it would be fun to visit "older brother" for the holidays.
