CLUB MEMBER RECEIVES PRESTIGIOUS AWARD



Recently, a member of our Club received a significant award. Some may not realize that the National Academy of Television Arts & Sciences, the group that hands out Emmys for TV shows, also awards Technical Emmys for technical excellence. On October 9, Ed Zylka was awarded an Emmy for his development of the Cable Modem, a major factor in getting TV and Internet into homes via cable. Today, any of us who subscribe to a cable provider, have a derivative of Ed's invention in their home.

Ed's wife, Tami, and their son, Alex, were in New York City to receive the award for Ed. As most of you know, Ed is suffering from advance dementia, and was unable to attend.

Ed was working on the development of cable modems for Zenith in the early 1990's and eventually moved to Encinitas, CA to work for General Instruments (GI.) While at GI, Ed and his team finished the design and filed patents for the first working two-way cable modem. By the end of the 90's, the Surfboard modem, as it was called, was the standard of the industry used by over 90% of the cable operators! After that, the Zylkas moved to Philadelphia and continued to work for GI. Eventually GI was taken over by Chicago based Motorola and the Zylkas moved to Lake Forest. Today, many of the modems used in our homes are branded Motorola or Arris, you can be assured that they all are based on Ed's original Surfboard design. In fact, Arris continues to use Surfboard name for its modems.

I would like to reminisce about Ed's involvement with our Club and the running community in general. Ed and Tami had an immediate impact on the Club holding after-parties after the Holiday Party. However, their most significant events were the backyard movie nights in the middle of the summer. Ed revived some classic movies for the Club to enjoy. After leaving Motorola, Ed set up a company to develop a wi-fi connected TV remote. Again, Ed was successful in his design and eventually sold the product design to Logitech, who now distributes the product. He eventually took the position as Executive Director for CARA. He made an immediate impact with a number of changes that brought a new, more positive image to CARA. One of his greatest impacts was the introduction of the GoRuns that brought casual races to a number of neighborhoods of Chicago. The GoRuns were based on the successful Park Runs in the UK.

We want to congratulate Ed, Tami, Adam, and Alex on this great honor. Something to be very proud of.

CHICAGO MARATHON

History on the Run

Marshall Field: Lake Forest Connections Part 2

In part one we learned that Lake Forest's John Farwell gave Marshall Field his start and that Lake Forest was the first site of a suburban Marshall Fields store. But indirectly Marshall Fields had additional impacts on Lake Forest and Lake Bluff.

An Aquarium

When Marshall Field died in 1906, he was replaced by Vice President John Shedd. Shedd joined Marshall Field in 1871 as a stock clerk and continued to rise through the ranks. During his tenure as President, Marshall Fields grew to become the largest store in Chicago and the largest wholesale and dry goods company in the world. Shedd died in 1926 but before his death contributed funds for the construction of the Shedd aquarium not far from the Field Museum of Natural History. We have Marshall Filed and his successor to thank for two of the museum campus' buildings.

Two Big Houses and A Library


John Shedd had two daughters. Daughter Laura married Charles Schweppe and as a wedding present dad built them one of Lake Forest's grandest estates, Mayflower Place at 405 Mayflower (Frederick Wainwright Perkins 1915). Daughter Helen married Kersey Coates Reed and together, dad was dead by then, they started building the house at 1315 Lake Road designed by David Adler. Unfortunately, Reed died while the house was being built but Helen continued with the construction and for a while lived in the tennis court house which also contained apartments which had the address 1310 Lake Road but is more visible from Elm Tree.

As a memorial to her deceased husband, Helen donated the funds for the Library we now see on Deerpath (Edwin Hill Clark 1931).



A London Department Store

This one also has no Lake Forest connection but may be of interest to the reader who has traveled to London. Harry Selfridge started working as a stock clerk at Marshall Field in 1876 and rose to be a junior partner in the Marshall Field company. Apparently, Selfridge is the one who started the "Only ---- Shopping Days Until Christmas" catchphrase. After a trip to London, he saw an opportunity and opened Selfridge's Department store in London's West End. I believe there was a PBS series regarding this several years ago. I visited Selfridge's earlier this year and it resembles the original State Street Marshall Fields store much more than today's Macy's version does.
